Consult with legal counsel and be briefed by staff members or consultants about actual or probable litigation, where such consultation or briefing in open meeting would adversely affect the local government's negotiating or litigating posture, as authorized by section 2.2-3711(A)(7) of the state code. The subject matter of the meeting—and the litigation—is 3. Discuss the performance and employment of specific local government personnel, as authorized by section 2.2-3711(A)(1) of the state code. The subject matter of the meeting is a specific local government employee. 4. Discuss the hiring or appointment of specific public officers, appointees, or employees, as authorized by section 2.2-3711(A)(1) of the state code. The subject matter is the hiring of a specific employee. The subject matter is the appointment of a specific public official. 5. Discuss the acquisition of real property for a public purpose, as authorized by section 2.2-3711(A)(3) of the state code. The subject matter is the possible acquisition of real property for [state purpose]. 6. Discuss the disposition of real property, where discussion in an open meeting would adversely affect the negotiating strategy of the public body, as authorized by section 2.2-3711(A)(3). The subject matter of the meeting is real estate owned by the local government. 7. Discuss the **relocation or expansion of business** or industry where no previous announcement has been made, as authorized by section 2.2-3711(A)(5) of the state code. The subject matter is a business which has indicated an interest in relocating to here or expanding operations within this locality. 8. Discussion of the award of a public contract involving the expenditure of public funds, including interviews of bidders or offerors, and discussion of the terms or scope of such contract, where discussion in an open session would adversely affect the bargaining position or negotiating strategy of the public body, as authorized by section 2.2-3711(A)(29) of the state code.
