Did you know that these extreme temperatures can take a huge toll on your physical health? There are many ways to keep cool in this hot weather we are experiencing. Number one is staying in an air-conditioned building. If you don't have air conditioning, find a cooling center or visit a store or shopping mall for a few hours if you are able. Have fans in your house to help circulate the air. Keep a cool wet towel on the back of your neck. Rewet it frequently.

STAY HYDRATED! Water, Gatorade and other electrolyte drinks are very important. Coffee, tea and alcohol are not recommended as they can dehydrate you.

Take cool baths or showers to reduce your body's temperature.

Close curtains and blinds during the day to block direct sunlight.

Open windows at night as the temperature drops for natural ventilation.

If you have older family members or neighbors, please check on them during this time. These temperatures are extreme and they may need some help. Stay cool everyone!
